Preparing the most important tool – You!

Caring for your voice

- Drink lots of water keep vocal cords moist
- Relax your face, neck and shoulders
- Take 4 slow deep breaths before you record an interview
- Stretch your neck
- Hum





Preparing the most important tool – You!

Caring for your voice cont.

- Tongue Twisters 'Peter Piper'.... & 'She sells sea shells...' to improve plosives and sibilants.
- Saying 'Red leather, yellow leather' 10 times before commencing strengthens your tongue and lips and also helps get your mouth and brain aligned!





Technical Equipment - Microphones

- Microphones come in a variety of shapes and sizes And quality!
- ✤ 3 main types of microphones:
 - Uni-directional (one direction the end)
 - Omni-directional (all around the microphone)
 - Cardioid records from a heart shaped surround sound

Regardless of the mic – to get the best sound, place the mic approximately15cm from your mouth (a fist's distance)

- Sennheiser
- Rode
- Blue Yeti
- AKG





Microphone/Equipment cont.

- ✤ A microphone will pick up all the sounds within its area of gain.
- The human ear filters out lots (can be hundreds) of sounds we don't need to be aware of. A microphone will not.
- Listen. Be aware of the sounds in your environment.
- Choose or adjust your environment to record in by giving priority to soft furnishings and minimal hard flat surfaces
